### FOR THE MEMBERS: CEU POLICY

The Massage Therapy Regulations require RMT members of the CMTNL to participate in continuing education activities as specified in guidelines published by the CMTNL.

The Quality Assurance, Education and Scope of Practice Committee has developed these guidelines, which have been approved by the board of directors, considering the CMTNL mandate and responsibilities and the needs of members.

### Each Continuing Education Unit (CEU) Cycle lasts for 3yrs.



RMT Members must obtain 30 CEUs each cycle:

- Category A (primary) 20 minimum
- Category B (secondary) 10 maximum

The CMTNL is committed to the promotion of knowledge, skills, standards, and proficiency through approval of continuing education in massage therapy, and defines continuing education as:

"Any learning experience, postgraduation, which directly relates to massage therapy and enhances a massage therapist's skill or practice." The CMTNL respects a
Massage Therapist's right to
develop in their own unique
direction and, therefore, this
learning experience may
include (but is not limited to):

- Courses
- Workshops
- Conferences
- Self-study

## FOR THE MEMBERS: CEU PORTFOLIO

It is the responsibility of the RMT members to keep a professional portfolio containing a detailed log of participation in continuing education activities using one of the following forms as appropriate:

#### **Shadowing Form**

Used when a massage therapist observes or shadows the practice of another health professional, to obtain a better understanding of other modalities, or to learn new techniques. A summary of this information must be transferred to the CEU Activity Recording Form.

#### **CEU Activity Recording Form**

Sign, date and submit with the completed activity report. On the final page of the report, record the total primary and secondary CEUs obtained. Attach copies of diplomas, receipts, etc. as proof of completion. Photocopy the form and keep copies up to date in a file labelled "Professional Portfolio". Keep photocopies of receipts, course brochures, and diplomas.

#### **Self-directed Learning Form**

Used for activities of independent study of professionally related journal articles, videos, monographs, texts and other materials, or a peer study group, in which two or more registrant's meet, to discuss and study the same. A summary of this information must be transferred to the CEU Activity Recording Form.





## FOR THE PUBLIC: CLIENT-CENTERED CARE

Client-centered care is a fundamental principle in various healthcare practices, including massage therapy. It emphasizes tailoring treatment to meet the unique needs and preferences of each individual client. Registered Massage Therapists in Newfoundland and Labrador are required to abide by Standards of Practice that model safe, client-centered care.



The Standards of Practice form the backbone for massage therapy practice, certification examinations and complaints investigations.

The Standards of Practice outline the minimum requirements for massage therapists to perform various tasks related to their practice, but provide the latitude for massage therapists to perform these tasks as they see fit.
